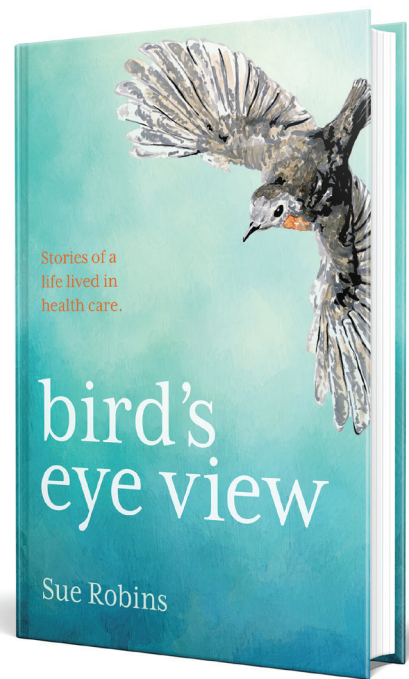


# bird's eye view
